

Algonquin Film Festival hosts Celeste Holm, Patricia Neal

Oscar-winning actresses Celeste Holm and Patricia Neal and Tony winner Elizabeth Wilson will attend the Algonquin Film Festival February 1 at the Eagle Fire Hall Ballroom, 46 North Sugan Road, New Hope.

Filmmaker Ray Glanzmann of Warrington interviewed the actresses for his documentary, "Broads," which will premiere at the second annual film festival, which runs January 29 to February 1.

The Algonquin Film Festival features a full lineup of independent films with an emphasis

on work from the "genius belt" between New York and Philadelphia.

On January 30, Carversville filmmaker Paul Gold will screen his short comedy "Big Day," at 11:30 a.m.

Craig Davidson and Donn Rogosin's documentary "East Wind, West Wind" about the life of Pearl Buck will screen 1:30 p.m. Saturday, January 31.

On Sunday, February 1, Oscar-winning screenwriter Ted Tally ("The Silence of the Lambs"), a resident of Solebury, will introduce screenwriter and playwright

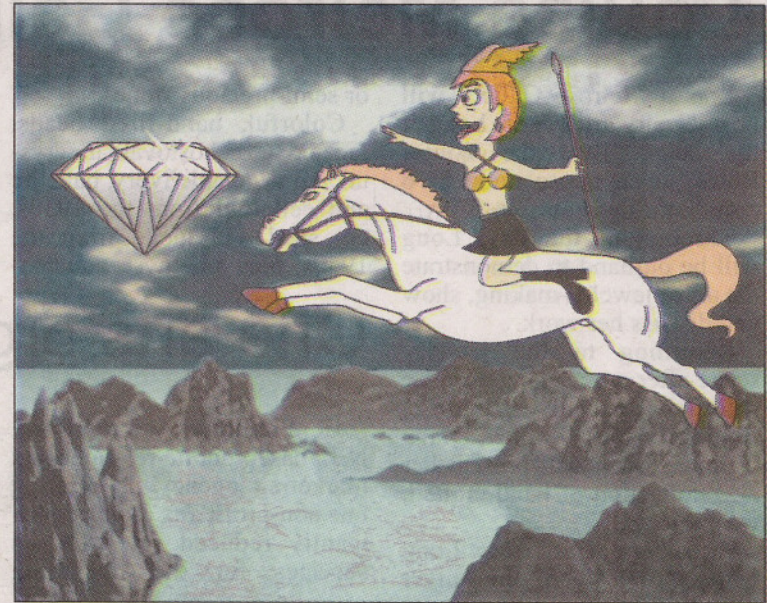
Christopher Durang, who will screen his short film, "A Day In The Life of Playwright Christopher Durang."

The festival also offers daily workshops and panel discussions designed to help independent filmmakers and inform cinephiles.

Each evening's social event from 8 to 10 p.m. is included in the price of a day pass, which is \$32.
